

Official Minutes of PAYNE COUNTY **BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS**

The Payne County Board of County Commissioners met in a regular meeting of the board at 9:00 a.m. on February 12th, 2024, at the Payne County Administration Building, Gloria Hesser Commissioners Meeting Room 200/201, located in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

Chairman Zach Cavett called the meeting to order: Meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m.

The following members were present: Zach Cavett - Commissioner District 1-Chairman, Rhonda Markum – Commissioner District 3-Vice Chairwomen, Chris Reding - Commissioner District 2-Member. Tammy Mathis - Chief Deputy County Clerk. Invocation by Chris Reding and Flag Salute to our country led by Dewey Clapp.

Approval or Modification of Minutes: Motion by Reding to approve minutes of February 5th, 2024, as presented, second by Markum. Roll Call Vote: Markum-Yes, Reding-Yes, Cavett-Yes.

Miscellaneous items from the Audience (no action will be taken): None presented on this date.

Discussion/Possible Action on Bid Openings - 9:30 AM: None presented on this date.

Discussion/Possible Action on Evaluations: None presented on this date.

Discussion/Possible Action – Use of Deductible Fund for Sheriff's Office: Sheriff Harper stated a 2020 Dodge Durango had all airbags go off, so the vehicle was deemed totaled. Harper will be using the vehicle for parts as everything else in the vehicle was fine. Motion by Reding to approve the use of deductible fund for the Sheriff's Office as presented, second by Markum. Discussion/Possible Action – Resolution 2024-07 Donation of \$50 Check to Sheriff's Office from Dale and Nancy Durham: Cavett stated the Sheriff's Office received a donation of \$50 from Dale and Nancy Durham. Motion by Markum to approve Resolution 2024-07 as presented, second by Reding. Roll Call Vote: Markum-Yes, Reding-Yes, Cavett-Yes.

Discussion/Possible Action - Mutual Cooperative Agreement with Town of Glencoe: Reding stated this was with the C.L.E.A.N Program who has at times helped in the town with walking trails or various needs. Motion by Reding to approve the agreement as presented, second by Markum. Roll Call Vote: Markum-Yes, Reding-Yes, Cavett-Yes.

Discussion/Possible Action - Final Plat Review and Possible Approval - Autumn Ridge Third Section: Aaron Ferguson presented the final plat for review to the board. Markum stated this was in her district and knew this was the third section to this plat. Cavett noted it does say on the plat no maintenance by the county as well as noting the deposit was paid ensuring the roads would be built to standard. Discussion/Possible Action – Sheriff's Office Questions Concerning Emergency Management for Interviews, Vehicles, Housing and Inventory: Sheriff Harper informed the board that his department had begun background checks on Emergency Management Director applicants that they had received so far and would like to be a part of the Executive Session and interview process for this position. Harper had questions about inventory and the EOC location for the department. The board is looking at interviews either February 28th or March 4th depending on completion of background checks. Discussion/Possible Action - Sherrif's Office Role in Payne County Radio Project: Sheriff Harper stated that he has met with Motorola, Dean, and Norm from TUSA off and on and stated there were several questions that he could not answer. Harper inquired with the board about placing an item on the agenda in regarding the Radio Project so should anything need to be addressed even weekly it would be allowable to discuss if placed on the weekly agendas. Harper stated that TUSA was hopeful that dispatch locations could be installed by May and the entire project complete by end of December. No action taken.
