- County Premium Pay Reding inquired on the amount for county premium pay. Cavett stated that what he had visited with David Floyd about was he took the number of county employees we had on the job and their regular stations and the total hours they worked from a particular point from COVID from approximately May to December and those who worked in their regular position not remotely or from home the hours that they worked not including holidays, sick and vacation leave, they would be paid a percentage and at different brackets. For example, an employee making over \$45,000 would be eligible for \$3,000 and a percentage they worked during COVID would be taken out of that \$3,000 and employees that make under \$45,000 would be eligible for \$5,000 with percentage applied the same way. If employee worked the entire time at their regular location , hours they would qualify for the full amount. Employee would have to still be employed with Payne County to qualify. Dates and specifics would be set by the board.
