Craig stated the company that the board approved to look at Payne Counties utilities bills, Troy and Banks was currently working on auditing our utility bill, and she was happy to report that they have recovered some from Birch Communications in the amount of \$133, and AT&T \$2,247.97.

Reding mentioned he would be scheduling at the end of summer, or early fall, a first responder, major incident, active shooter, self-care, care for others training with the training being free just the expense of the person coming in to conduct the training. Reding stated he would send out an email to get an idea on an employee head count for participation. Reding stating it would probably take a full day or ³/₄ of a day offering several days to chose from.
